Alexander S. Gsoell, 63, of Gentry, Arkansas, died October 5, 2008, at Washington Regional Medical Center in Fayetteville, Arkansas. Born February 17, 1945 in Vienna, Austria he came to the US in 1960. He became a US citizen in 1987. A graduate of the Dayton Art Institute of Dayton, Ohio, he joined Hallmark Cards, Inc. in Kansas City, Missouri. After nearly 22 years with Hallmark he was a free-lance artist for a number of years.
