Beryl Perry, 88, of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, died May 2, 2008, at his home. He was born April 9, 1920, in Geary County, Kansas, to William and Etta Dempsy Perry. Beryl was raised on a farm near Junction City, Kansas, and graduated from high school there in 1938. He served in the U.S. Navy as a radioman during World War II and the Korean War. He moved to Dodge City, Kansas, in 1947, and worked for Munns Medical Supply and Equipment as a salesman. He retired to rural Granby, Missouri, in 1976, where he raised cattle and was an avid gardener. He moved to Rogers, Arkansas, in 1991, and to Siloam Springs in 2002. Beryl enjoyed outdoor activities and was a football and baseball enthusiast. Beryl was preceded in death by Erlene Walker Perry, his wife of 62 years; one daughter, Lana Johnson; two brothers; and a grandson. Survivors include his son Dallas Perry and wife Melissa of Rogers, Arkansas; one daughter, Shereen West and husband Dennis of Siloam Springs, Arkansas; five grandchildren; 4 great-grandchildren; one brother, Wayne Perry of Salina, Kansas; two sisters, Bonnie Knapp and Elaine Bethe both of Salina, Kansas. A memorial graveside service with military honors will be 11:00 A.M. Wednesday, May 7, 2008, at Fayetteville National Cemetery with Pastor Jason Murray officiating.
