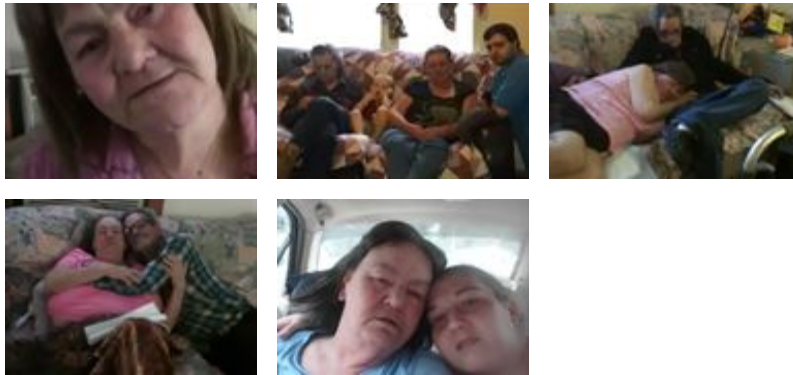


Hi Nakia
