Arnold of Colcord, Oklahoma, and Buford "Bo" Monday of Locust Grove, Oklahoma; numerous nieces and nephews.

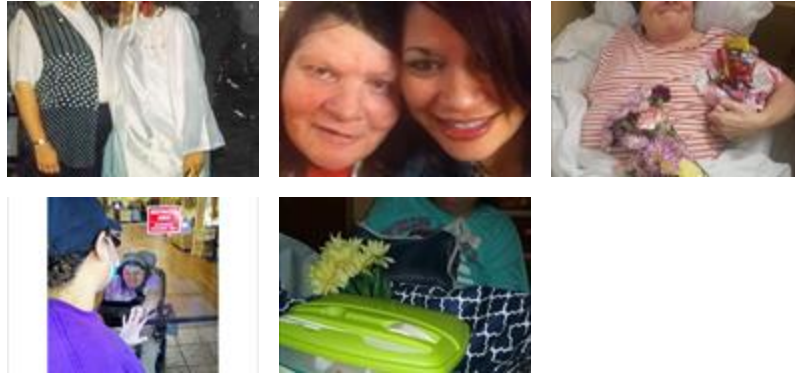
