“ I first met Cody when she and I were in the ninth and tenth grades, respectively - we became fast friends, and it was clear to me from our earliest conversations that Cody was one of the kindest, most compassionate, and tenderhearted people I'd ever had the pleasure to come to know. I understand that the vast majority of those who are reading this knew Cody, personally - so, you know this as well as I do.

We were separated by circumstance, and lost touch with each other during our high school years - and, although I thought about Cody countless times over the years, hoping that she was well and happy, it wasn't until this past spring that she and I connected with one another again. (Thanks, Sandye. You're the best. Your reconnecting me with Cody is the greatest gift I've ever been given.) I cannot tell you how excited and overjoyed I was to know that I'd soon be speaking with Cody, again - and, when we finally got the opportunity to catch up via telephone, it was like time had stood still. It's impossible for me to express just how happy I was to hear her voice. Incredible.

We talked regularly, and for extended periods of time. Sometimes we spoke casually about trivial things - other times about those things that matter the most to both of us. We talked about what each of us wanted out of the future - what we wanted for our loved ones, what we wanted from our friendships and for them, and how we would never waste the opportunity that fate had given us to renew our friendship, and take extra special care to make sure that we remained close for the rest of our lives.

At the beginning of the summer I temporarily moved to central Arkansas to help take care of my sister, who is not in good health. When I made this move, Cody and I promised each other that we would stay in close contact with one another via telephone and online messaging, until we could reunite in person - and, we each kept this promise. The time I've spent talking with Cody these past few months has been among the best hours I've spent during my

entire thirty-three years on this planet.

Again, I know that most of you who are reading this know Cody very well, and so I don't have to extol her myriad virtues here, since you've all come to witness them time and time again, over the years - but, I feel like this is the time and the place for just such a celebration of this phenomenal woman that we all loved so much: Cody was among the sweetest, most sincere, creative people I've ever known ; she chose the career that she did because she had a heart for helping people; and, perhaps the most obvious of all to those who spent even a moment with her: when it came to those she cared about, she loved them unconditionally, and with all her heart (Especially her boys - she would have done absolutely anything in this world to secure their happiness and well being). I've never known a person with more of a zest for life than Cody - and, I doubt that I ever will. She was, and is, everything I hope to someday become as a person.

Cody and I never got the opportunity to talk with one another face to face, like we'd wanted to - we'd planned to do that sometime soon. In the meantime, again, we'd promised one another, we'd keep in touch as often as possible. This is a promise I have no intention of breaking now. Cody, I'm here for you - and, will always be here for you. I pray that you are completely without pain and at rest - and enjoying all of the love that we're collectively giving you, now.

Cody Rae Moore, I love you - with all of my heart; and, I always will.
