



Dalmer Daharsh

March 17, 1931 - January 14, 2011

Dalmer “Lefty” Neil Daharsh, 79, of Decatur, Arkansas, died January 14, 2011, at Ashley Health Center, Rogers, Arkansas. Born March 17, 1931, in Emporia, Kansas, he was the son of Chester Eckdall Daharsh and Lula Hassman Daharsh. He lived most of his life in the Decatur area and was a hatchery manager for Peterson Industries. He also worked at two hardware stores, Bevers Hardware in Gentry, and Buy-Right Hardware in Decatur. He served in the Marines during the Korean War. Lefty married Betty Jean Shook in Decatur, Arkansas, on July 6, 1951. He was affiliated with the Falling Springs Church, Decatur.
