



## Daniel Cundiff

June 28, 1936 - October 3, 2005

Daniel "Sonny" Paul Dundiff, 69 year-old resident of Watts, Oklahoma, died October 3, 2005, at the Veteran's Hospital, Fayetteville, Arkansas. Born June 28, 1936 in Siloam Springs, Arkansas, he was the son of Paul Cundiff and Dortha Woods Cundiff. He served in the Marine Corps from 1953 to 1973 and participated in the Korean War, Vietnam War, and the conflict in the Dominican Republic. Sonny was preceded in death by one sister, Joan Douthit. Survivors include two sons, Tim Cundiff and Marty Cundiff, both of Washington State; two brothers, Donald Gene Cundiff and wife Lucy of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, and R.L. Cundiff and wife Sandy of West Siloam Springs, Oklahoma; two sisters, Iris Sue Verser and husband Clifford of Decatur, Arkansas, and Delores Ames of West Siloam Springs, Oklahoma.
