Darrel Wayne Abshier, 79 year old resident of Colcord, Oklahoma, died December 30, 2014 at Circle of Life Hospice Home, Springdale, Arkansas. 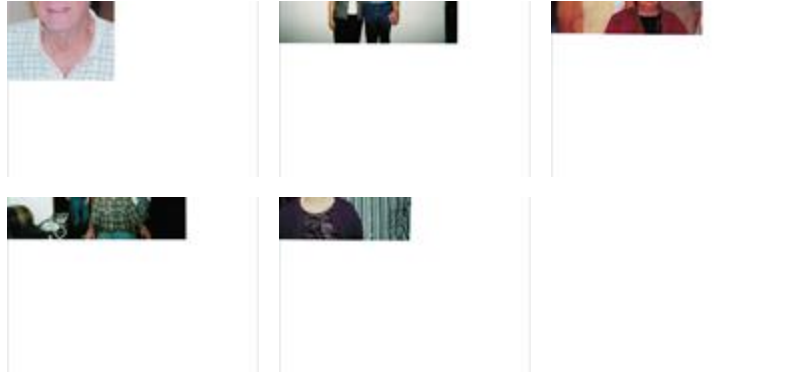
