Dolores Adams, 70, of Bentonville, Arkansas, and former long time resident of Gentry, died Saturday, January 26, 2013, at Circle of Life Hospice in Springdale. Born February 24, 1942, in Kansas City, Missouri, she was the daughter of Fred G. Adams and Erma Hester Dodd. Dolores graduated from the Ozark Adventist Academy in Gentry in 1960. She attended Union College in Lincoln, Nebraska, and the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville.
