March 5, 1918 - January 25, 2007

Dorothy Maye Golden Sykes, 88 year-old resident of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, went to be with the Lord on Thursday, January 25, 2007, at Valley Springs Assisted Living Center, West Siloam Springs, Oklahoma. Born March 5, 1918, in Mosheim, Texas, she was the daughter of Sam and Lula Golden. She married Henry Alvis Sykes on May 20, 1936 in Happy, Texas. They moved to Siloam Springs in 1953. She worked as an aide at Woodland Manor in Siloam Springs for eight years. They moved to Bowie, Texas in 1979. She returned to Siloam Springs in 1994 following the death of her husband in 1988. She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, two brothers, and two sisters.
