



Frederick "Dale" Sugg

April 10, 1924 - February 10, 2021

Frederick Dale Sugg was born on April 10, 1924 in Gentry, AR, to Edwin Green and Artincie Mae Gabriel Sugg the youngest of five children. He was named after his Uncle Fred but was always called Dale. He grew up in Gentry until his senior year when the family moved to Poteau, OK, where he graduated from high school in 1942. After graduation he joined the Navy following in the footsteps of his older brother John. After WWII Dale went to watch repair school and opened a shop in Siloam Springs where his parents then lived. He was recalled to the Navy during the Korean Conflict then helped run a dry cleaning business with his oldest sister Grace when he came home to Siloam Springs. He married Betty Bailey on June 21, 1953 in Sulphur Springs, and they made their home in Siloam Springs with their two children Deanna and Eric until 1975 when relocating to Rogers. Dale went to night school to learn accounting then worked at Ozark Electric in Fayetteville and Franklin Electric and Webb Wheel in Siloam Springs. At Webb Wheel he was trained in computer programming and became a Systems Analyst there and later at Rogers Tool Works in Rogers. After retirement he moved back to Siloam Springs. He married Peggy Koschke in 1999. He was a lifetime member of the Methodist Church. Dale is survived by his wife Peggy of the home, daughter Deanna Rocha and granddaughter Gina Rocha of Tulsa, OK, grandson Aaron Rocha of Stillwater, OK, sister-in-law Ann Sugg of Springdale, AR, stepson Wes Koschke and granddaughter Vera Koschke of Yates Center, KS, and many nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by

his first wife Betty and son Eric Sugg. A memorial service will be held 10:30 a.m., Saturday, April 10, 2021 at the Siloam Springs First United Methodist Church.
