



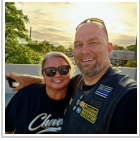
George Lamb

August 13, 1928 - January 13, 2009

George Edward Lamb, 80, of Colcord, Oklahoma died January 13, 2009, at Washington Regional Hospital, Fayetteville, Arkansas. He was born August 13, 1928 in Montgomery, Alabama. George was an Air Force Veteran of the Korean War and a former Navy Veteran. He was a retired truck driver for Great Lakes Chemical.
