December 13, 1910 - March 3, 2007

Hattie Ann Woods, 96-year-old resident of Siloam Springs, died Saturday, March 3, 2007, at Circle of Life Hospice in Springdale. Born December 13, 1910, in Union Community, Delaware County, Oklahoma, she was the daughter of Oscar H. Mills and Dora Belle Apple Mills and had been a longtime Siloam Springs resident. Mrs. Woods was a homemaker and had been a member of the Sequoyah Quilters Club. She was a member of First Christian Church in Siloam Springs. She was preceded in death in 2003 by Willis Woods, her husband of 70 years.
