January 29, 1923 - July 6, 2014

Dr. Helen Bradshaw Wilmoth, 91 year old resident of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, died on July 6, 2014 at Quail Ridge Nursing Center. She was born January 29, 1923 in Madison County, Arkansas, to Burl Bradshaw and Artie Elzey Bradshaw. Helen married Edward Wilmoth in Bentonville, Arkansas on May 4, 1946. They were long time residents of Decatur, Arkansas as well as Siloam Springs. She worked many years as a teacher in elementary and high school, before becoming a professor at John Brown University, where she retired. Helen was a member of the Eastern Star.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Edward; her parents, and one son, Keith Wilmoth.
