Jack L. Farley, 80, of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, died May 12, 2013, at his home. Born December 30, 1932, in Siloam Springs, he was the son of Jesse John Farley and Grace Daniels Farley. He attended John Brown University, Oklahoma State Tech, and Evangel College in Springfield, Missouri. Jack served in the Army during the Korean Era. In Tulsa, he worked in the oil and gas production industry as a buyer and international expediter for Crest Engineering, Inc., and Williams Engineering. He was a member of the NOMADS and former board member of the Cleaning Equipment Manufacturing Association. He lived in Tulsa for 36 years and moved back to Siloam Springs in 1986 to join his brother at Farley's Inc. In Siloam Springs, he was a member of First United Methodist Church and the Siloam Springs Rotary Club.
