June 4, 1917 - May 25, 2012

James “Jim” Alick Hendrix, 94, of Gentry, Arkansas, died May 25, 2012, at Northwest Medical Center, Bentonville, Arkansas. Born June 4, 1917, in Crowell, Texas, he was the son of James Marvin Hendrix and Dilla Cansora Cawthron Hendrix. He was a Navy Veteran of World War II. Jim was a carpenter and a farmer. He helped build the new United Methodist Church building in Highfill, after the first building burned. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge at Vaughn, and the Elks Club in Rogers. He married Emma Mae Moyer in Yuma Arizona.

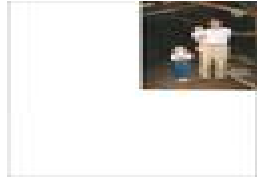
