May 8, 1918 - February 5, 2008

John Floyd Tenbrook, 89 year-old resident of Gentry, Arkansas, died February 5, 2008, at Siloam Springs Memorial Hospital, Siloam Springs, Arkansas. Born May 8, 1918, in Delaware County, Oklahoma, he was the son of Earl Tenbrook and Alta Vivian West Tenbrook. He graduated from Gentry High School in 1936. After high school he joined the CCC for two years, then helped build Camp Crowder at Neosho, Missouri. He was a veteran of World War II as a quartermaster attached to the air corps, and attained the rank of corporal. On December 4, 1943, he married Valerie Douthit. They resided in Oklahoma City and were employed by Douglas Aircraft. In 1950, they moved back to Gentry where they resided. He was an avid farmer and employed by the Arkansas State Highway Department. He enjoyed fishing, hunting, and gardening. He was a member of the VFW and DAV, the Colcord Oklahoma chapter of AARP, and a member of the First Baptist Church of Gentry, since 1963. Survivors include two sons: Johnny L. Tenbrook of Gentry, Arkansas, Tom L. Tenbrook of Gentry, Arkansas; two grandsons, John C. Tenbrook, and Thomas J. Tenbrook; two granddaughters, Jerri D. Sorum, and Nicole J. Tenbrook; two great grandsons, Jeran Sorum and Tristan Martin; one great granddaughter, Savannah Martin; two brothers: Jack Tenbrook of Rolla, Kansas, and Dallas Tenbrook of Wichita, Kansas; one sister: Audean Beck of Canute, Oklahoma; and numerous nieces and nephews. Funeral services will be 2:00 pm, Friday, February 8, 2008 at First Baptist Church, Gentry, Arkansas, with Mark Evans and Dr. Robin Cowin officiating. Burial will follow

at Oak Hill Cemetery, Siloam Springs, Arkansas. Visitation will be 6:00 to 8:00 p.m., Thursday, February 7, 2008 at Wasson Funeral Home, Inc., Siloam Springs, Arkansas.
