“ Junior is sorely missed by all who knew him, and a whole lot of folks knew him. I highly doubt he ever had an enemy in his entire life. He was that likable.

I first met Junior around 2004 when he responded to my Craigslist ad for a Shopsmith Router table with a mounted Hitachi 3 h.p. route. I was amazed at how mentally sharp he was, being 71, myself being about 38 at the time. He spoke so to the point and was agile. He climbed underneath it to inspect it with ease. I never saw anyone over 70 talk and move so fluidly. Junior and I didn't visit nearly as often as I would have liked being that he lived in Siloam and I was always busy, working constantly (and switching jobs more often than I preferred), over here in the Rogers area. Apparently, I'm often misunderstood and not so well liked but Junior "got me".

I'll always remember how he sort of seemed to know where most of his tools were. I'll always remember how he downsized from time to time, sort of reorganize, and there he goes again, buying up a trailer full of tools and machines "to cleanup and pass on". It seemed it was never about the money. Junior seemed to take joy in making something nicely usable again for the sole purpose of passing it on to someone else to enjoy.

I remember him talking to his granddaughter Haley, about 5 or 6 at the time. I never officially met Junior's wife but I saw and heard her once when she called out to him, "Junior, are you coming in for lunch?"

I'll remember how he could be really busy when I showed up and say "It's okay, I enjoy visiting with people." It became obvious to me why his shops were constantly in disarray. Like me, he could easily be taken off task. He would be busy, get sidetracked/interrupted, literally drop what he was doing (including the tools he was using), only to find himself constantly wondering where he subconsciously set something down. I bet he spent hours hunting things down. We shared that characteristic for sure so "I got him" as well.

I have no doubt that Junior is resting in heavenly peace.

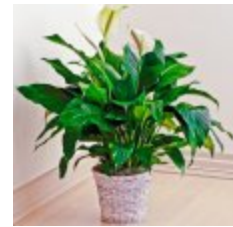

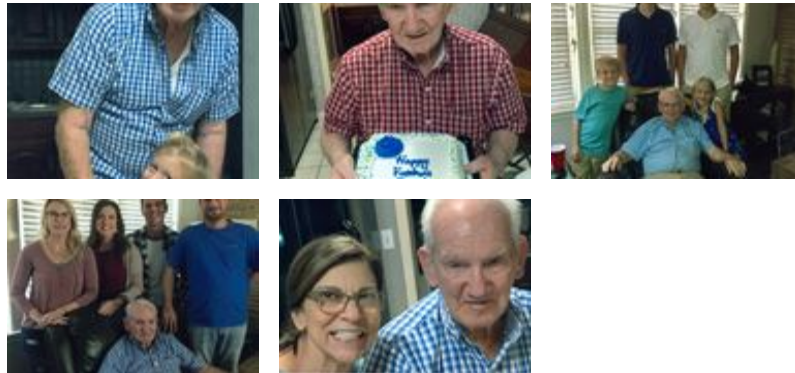
