Leroy Cephas Carpenter, 89 year old resident of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, died November 30, 2015 at his home. Born September 14, 1926 in Westville, Illinois, he was the son of Leroy F. Carpenter and Nellie Blakeney Carpenter. He was a Marine Corps Veteran of World War II. Leroy married Garnet Elaine Hatten on February 17, 1959 in Las Vegas, Nevada.
