



## Lewis Nichols

April 13, 1922 - August 17, 2006

Lewis Roy Nichols, 84 year-old resident of Watts, Oklahoma, died August 17, 2006, at his home. Born April 13, 1922, in Cherokee County, Oklahoma, he was the son of Charley Nichols and Myrtle Yount Nichols. He lived most of his life in Adair County, Oklahoma, but was a former resident of Cherokee County, Oklahoma. He was an Army Veteran of World War II, and received the Purple Heart and Bronze Star for his military service. He was a retired carpenter and a member of the Military Order of the Purple Heart of Muskogee, Oklahoma, and served as a deacon at the First Baptist Church, Watts, Oklahoma. He married Wanda Morine Carnes in Tahlequah, Oklahoma, in 1944. He was preceded in death by one daughter and son-in-law, Judy Lou Bransum and Duane Bransum in 1989. Survivors include his wife Wanda of the home; one son, Larry Roy Nichols and wife Jeanie of Adair County, Oklahoma; five grandchildren; three great grandchildren; and one sister, Lucille Coday of Overland Park, Kansas. Funeral services will be 10:00 a.m., Monday, August 21, 2006, at Wasson Memorial Chapel, Siloam Springs, Arkansas, with Ronnie Bradshaw and Rod Arnold officiating. Burial will follow at Johnson Cemetery, West Siloam Springs, Oklahoma. Visitation will be 3:00 to 4:30 p.m., Sunday, August 20, 2006, at Wasson Funeral Home, Siloam Springs, Arkansas.
