October 20, 1930 - July 8, 2008

Lucile Paul, 77 year-old resident of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, died July 8, 2008 at her home. She graduated from Southwest Baptist University with an associate's degree and from Missouri Southern University with a bachelor's degree in education.
