I was the fishing/hunting one and he was the golf and basketball guy. It is hard to remember how athletic he was before he had life threatening surgery in the mid-1970s.

In trying to help get his tax records to his clients this week I have got to meet so many of his clients. They also seemed to be his friends. They admired his unwillingness to push the IRS and while getting every allowable deduction, he was quick to tell anyone that he wasn't going to be anything but a square shooter.

One Mexican restaurant owner told me she had used him since the 1990s and had said a mass in his name. Others expressed that same trust and confidence in what he did for them. And oh, so many have said, "He was a really good golfer." Lyle was passionate about his golf. He shot a hole in one in Bella Vista and has a long list of his eagles shot in most every golf course in NW Arkansas and everywhere from Denver to the famed St. Andrews in Scotland. He even put together his own golf clubs to exacting specifications trying to eke out that one extra point.

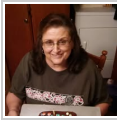
On behalf of the Moore & Kruse family, let us pass our deepest condolences.
