Marie Snapp, 88 year-old resident of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, died August 30, 2006. Born September 27, 1917, in Tulsa, Oklahoma, she was the daughter of John C. Ingle and Myrtle Hoyle Ingle. She moved to Siloam Springs in November of 1977 from Chandler, Oklahoma, where she had been involved in numerous charitable organizations. She was a volunteer at Siloam Springs Memorial Hospital where she was a Pink Lady, and played bridge in several local bridge groups.
