She was a Sunday school teacher and sang in the church choir. She was a Cub Scout den mother and active in the PTA. Her interests included sewing, quilting, jig saw puzzles and homemaking. She especially enjoyed baking. She loved living in beautiful Northwest Arkansas. Marjorie is survived by her husband, Arch Roller, twin sons Alden Roller of Little Rock and Alan Roller and wife Nancy of Tontitown, sister Marney Anderson of Checotah, Oklahoma, several nieces and nephews, and a host of friends. She is preceded in death by her parents, stepfather, three brothers and two sisters. Funeral services will be 2:00 p.m.
