



## Marshall Logan Orcutt

June 6, 1939 - November 29, 2025

Marshall Orcutt, one of the finest men of our time, passed away at his home in Siloam Springs, Arkansas November 29, 2025. If you didn't know him, ask the next person you meet to tell you about him. Father, friend, farmer and sailor only begin to describe the man he was, devoted foremost to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Born June 6, 1939 in Hollywood, California, he grew up in an era that gave him the freedom to chart his own path – from a thriving egg business in his early teens to college at Cal Poly, marriage to Robin Rudolph and service in the US Army, working on and developing family ventures in citrus and cattle, and later row crops in Arkansas. He wove in motorcycle and backpacking trips, sailing the intercoastal waterway, mission trips and perhaps his most fulfilling work, serving as a Gideon.

His family is not alone in its grief but joins with multitudes near and far to cheer him on to his home in Glory, where we someday hope to again feel the strength and warmth of his handshake.

Marshall was preceded in death by his wife of sixty-two years, Robin Rudolph Orcutt; parents John and Alice (Pedersen) Orcutt; brother William Orcutt and sister Mary Alice (Orcutt) Henderson. He is survived by children Dan Orcutt, Molly (Orcutt) Torres with husband Randy, and Sarah Orcutt; grandchildren
