Martin A. Younger, 81 year-old resident of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, died July 31, 2007 Medical Lodge of Neosho, Missouri. Born May 27, 1926 in Siloam Springs, Arkansas, he was the son of Warren Younger and Martha Ann Martin Younger. He graduated from Colcord High School in 1943. Martin was a Master Chief Petty Officer, retired, U.S. Navy. He served during World War II and in Korea. Masonic Lodge, Scottish Rite, York Rite, member of Twin Springs Christian Church and First Christian Church Gentry, and a life long resident of Siloam Springs.
