Marvin Wood, 95 year-old resident of Kansas, Oklahoma, died August 29, 2014 at St. John's Medical Center, Tulsa, Oklahoma. Born January 31, 1919 in Rose, Oklahoma, he was the son of John Wood and Flora (Hankins) Wood. He was married to Imogene Milner for 67 years. Marvin was a World War II Army Veteran of the South Pacific. He worked as a mail carrier in Tulsa and also enjoyed checking his cows. He was a member of the American Legion and First Baptist Church in Kansas, Oklahoma.
