November 30, 1908 - February 28, 2006

Maurice Lee Moore Sr., 97-year-old resident of Rogers, Arkansas, died February 28, 2006, at his residence. Born November 30, 1908, in Granby, Missouri, he was the son of Calvin E. Moore, Sr. and Laura Bragg Moore. He had been a resident of the Northwest Arkansas and Northeast Oklahoma area for the past 75 years, having lived in Lincoln and Rogers, Arkansas, and Westville, Oklahoma. Mr. Moore was a U. S. Navy Veteran of World War II. He had owned and operated a poultry farm. He was a member of the United Methodist Church. He married Ellen Christine Eoff in Neosho, Missouri in 1933. He was preceded in death by his wife in 2001; six brothers; and two sisters. Survivors include three sons, Lee Moore and his wife Linda of Corpus Christie, Texas; Doug Moore and his wife Jerre of Ft. Smith, Arkansas; and Paul Moore and his wife Beth of Nashville, Tennessee; one daughter, Alice McQuay and her husband Boyce of Siloam Springs, Arkansas; one brother, Calvin Moore of Austin, Texas; five grandchildren; and ten great grandchildren. Graveside services will be held Friday, March 3, at 11:00 a.m. at National Cemetery in Fayetteville, Arkansas, with Rev. Marvin Eck officiating.
