July 12, 1917 - May 29, 2008

Maurice Eldon Robb, 88, of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, died May 29, 2008, at Siloam Springs Nursing and Rehab, Siloam Springs, Arkansas. Born July 12, 1919, in Decatur, Arkansas, he was the son of Benjamin M. Robb and Edna Campbell Robb. He was a fieldman for Pet Milk Company, retiring in 1979, and a Farm Loan Officer with Arvest. He was a veteran of World War II, serving in Europe. He was a Paul Harris Fellow in the Rotary Club and an active supporter of the Future Farmers of American and the 4-H Club. He served on the Siloam Springs Museum Board and Hospital Board as well as in many leadership positions within the Methodist Church. He received the Pioneer Citizen Award from the Siloam Springs Chamber of Commerce in 1996 for his service to the community. On November 9, 1943, he married Mina Ruth Shepp in Kansas City, Missouri. He was preceded in death by his parents; two brothers, Cecil Robb, Leroy Robb; two sisters, Roxanna Good and Ruth Arundale; and one granddaughter, Robin Woods. Survivors include his wife Mina Ruth of the home; three daughters, Carolyn Judy and husband Dwight of League City, Texas, Nancy House and husband Dick of Norman, Oklahoma, and Linda Woods and husband Bruce of Russellville, Arkansas; five grandchildren; seven great-grandchildren; and one sister, Mary Agnes Robb of Lenexa, Kansas. Funeral services will be 10:00 a.m., Monday, June 2, 2008, at The First United Methodist Church, Siloam Springs, Arkansas, with Dr. Richard House and Dr. Randy Rowlan officiating. Burial will be at 2:00 p.m. in Decatur Cemetery, Decatur, Arkansas. Military Honors will
