



Mildred "Juanita" Ayling

September 12, 1920 - December 7, 2013

Mildred "Juanita" Ayling, 93 year-old resident of Wichita, Kansas, formerly of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, stepped into the arms of her loving Savior, Jesus Christ, December 7, 2013 at Meadowlark Adult Care Center, Wichita, Kansas. Born September 12, 1920 in Delaware County, Oklahoma, she was the daughter of Elza Roberts and Ollie E. Phipps Roberts. Juanita married Louis Jefferson "Jeff" Ayling on October 5, 1946 in Fayetteville, Arkansas. She worked as a cashier for Wal-Mart and IGA Grocery Store. Juanita was a member of Harvard Avenue Baptist Church, Siloam Springs, Arkansas.

Juanita was preceded in death by her husband, her son, Louis Jefferson Ayling II; her sister, Irene and Raymond Hunton, and her brother, Claude and Ada Roberts.

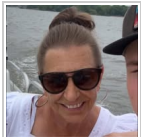
