August 21, 1919 - April 15, 2007

Mildred Hope McCown, 87 year-old resident of Gentry, Arkansas, died April 15, 2007 at Washington Regional Medical Center, Fayetteville, Arkansas. Born August 21, 1919 in Gentry, Arkansas, she was the daughter of George Washington Martin and Clara Beatrice Crawford Martin. Mildred was a Registered Nurse and lived in Levittown, Pennsylvania for 20 years. She traveled with her husband from 1941 to 1945 and 1950 to 1969, while he was in military service. She was a shipbuilder during World War II. She married Elmer Dale McCown on November 17, 1945 in Siloam Springs, Arkansas. She was a member of Colcord Missionary Baptist Church, Colcord, Oklahoma.

She was preceded in death by her husband on January 28, 2005; two sisters, Mamie Van and Alma Welton; and one brother, Harry Martin.

Survivors include two sons: Dale Crawford McCown and wife Renee of Springdale, Arkansas, Matthew Shawn McCown of Altamonte Springs, Florida; 4 grandchildren; three great grandchildren; and a number of nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be 2:00 p.m., Thursday, April 19, 2007, at Wasson Memorial Chapel, Siloam Springs, Arkansas, with Carl McReynolds officiating. There will be a private family burial at Bloomfield Cemetery, Gentry, Arkansas. The family will receive friends from 5:00 to 7:30 p.m., Wednesday, April 18,
