April 25, 1910 - November 10, 2010

Milton Reese Jensen, 100, of Gentry, Arkansas, died Wednesday, November 10, 2010, in Keene, Texas. Born April 25, 1910, in Early, Iowa, he was the son of Charles Jensen and Lizzie Drury Jensen. Milton was a farmer and, prior to enlisting for military service, was a Harley Davidson Motorcycle dealer in Dixon and Freeport, Illinois. He served in World War II, and was a Purple Heart recipient. He was a member of the Seventh-day Adventist Church in Siloam Springs, Arkansas. Milton was an honorary lifetime member of the Rock River Riders Motorcycle Club. He was a founding member of the club when it was formed in Illinois in 1935. He was preceded in death by his parents; wife Alice Lewis Jensen; and brother, Walter Jensen. Survivors include two sons, David Jensen and wife Donna, and Jim Jensen and wife Jeanne, all of Gentry, Arkansas; one daughter, Anne Giddings and husband John of Keene, Texas; four grandchildren: Luke Giddings, Mark Jensen, Philip Giddings, and Sara Dale; three great grandchildren: Anthem Giddings, Solace Giddings, and Milo Dale; one brother, Lawrence Jensen and wife Glenyce of Early, Iowa; and several nieces and nephews. Funeral services will be 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, November 16, 2010, at Wasson Memorial Chapel, Siloam Springs, Arkansas. Burial will follow at Gentry Cemetery, Gentry, Arkansas, with the Patriot Guard Motorcycle Riders accompanying the procession.
