Ray Taylor, 79-year-old resident of Gentry, Arkansas, died Tuesday, May 31, 2005, in Siloam Springs, Arkansas. Born January 6, 1926, in Gentry, he was the son of Alfred Taylor and Mary Francis Norfleet Taylor.
