



Rev. Lola Miller

December 16, 1910 - May 2, 2005

Rev. C. Lola Wilkins Miller, 94 year-old resident of Bentonville, Arkansas, died May 2, 2005, at Northwest Medical Center, Bentonville, Arkansas. Born December 16, 1910 in Decatur, Arkansas, she was the daughter of Syloam Wilkins and Iva Leona Burrow Wilkins. She was ordained in 1945 by Dr. Hardy C. Powers, General Superintendent of the Nazarene Church. She ministered in Louisiana, Arkansas, and Kansas in the Church of the Nazarene. Upon her retirement, she moved to Bentonville, Arkansas, and became a member of the Bella Vista Church of the Nazarene, Bella Vista, Arkansas. She married Rev. Arthur A. Miller on January 1, 1960. Rev. Miller was preceded in death by her husband in 1980; one step-son, Rev. Allen B. Miller; two step-daughters, Helen Chisum and Pauline McCaleb; five brothers, Elmer Wilkins, Alonzo Wilkins, Ray Wilkins, J.B. Wilkins and Floyd Wilkins; and three sisters, Esther Cheney, Juanita Larson and Minnie Leona Wilkins. Survivors include two stepsons, Dr. Norman O. Miller of Edmond, Oklahoma, and Wendell L. Miller of Overland Park, Kansas; one brother, Delbert E. Wilkins of Gentry, Arkansas; one sister, Rosetta Drake of Zepherhills, Florida; several grandchildren and great grandchildren; and a host of relatives and friends. Funeral services will be 2:00 p.m., Wednesday, May 4, 2005, at Wasson Memorial Chapel, Siloam Springs, Arkansas, with Rev. Anthony Baker officiating.
