Bob Henry, 101-year-old resident of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, died Saturday, August 27, 2006, in Springdale, Arkansas. Born July 18, 1905, in Siloam Springs, he was the son of Robert C. Henry and Nellie Henry. Bob was a lifetime resident of Siloam Springs and a former longtime mayor of Siloam. He and his brother Ralph co-owned and operated R.C.
