Ronald Robrahn, 86-year-old resident of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, died December 25, 2004, in Siloam Springs Memorial Hospital. Born June 18, 1918, in Gridley, Kansas, he was the son of Carl W. Robrahn and Maude Fleming Robrahn. Ronald had lived in Siloam Springs since 1946, moving here from Kansas City. He Married Doris Laurence December 29, 1939, in Lexington, Missouri.
