



## Stanley Russell

May 20, 1917 - December 20, 2008

Stanley Russell, 91 of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, died Saturday, December 20, 2008, in Siloam Springs. Born May 20, 1917, in Memphis, Michigan, he was the son of Vernon and Beatrice Maston Russell. Mr. Russell was a World War II veteran of the Army Air Corps serving as a tail gunner during the European Theatre. He married Faye Barnes November 27, 1945, in Detroit, Michigan, where he served as a police officer for more than 20 years. After retirement he worked as a security guard at a Detroit hospital and in Siloam Springs as an auxiliary police officer. Stanley enjoyed hunting, fishing and gardening. He was a member of American Legion in Siloam Springs, and New Sulphur Freewill Baptist Church near Prairie Grove. Survivors include his wife Faye of the home; 2 sons, Keith Lee Russell of Highlands Ranch, Colorado; Richard Allen Russell of Sterling Heights, Michigan; 1 granddaughter, Samantha Barnes Neves of Parker, Colorado; and a number of nieces and nephews. Visitation will be Tuesday, December 23, from 6:00 to 8:00 P.M. at Wasson Funeral Home, Siloam Springs. Funeral services will be 2:00 P.M. Wednesday, December 24, at Wasson Memorial Chapel with Rev.
