



## Vernon Robeson

December 23, 1931 - April 5, 2006

Vernon "Martin" Robeson, 74 year-old resident of Gentry, Arkansas, died April 5, 2006, at his residence. Born December 23, 1931 in Cando, North Dakota, he was the son of Harold Robeson and Lucile Martin Robeson. He was an Army Veteran of the Korean Conflict. He was a teacher and a principal and moved to the Gentry area in 1997. Mr. Robeson was a life member of the National Rifle Association and a member of the Seventh Day Adventist Church, Gentry, Arkansas. He had many hobbies, but his special interest was in coin collecting. On June 30, 1957, he married Lauralee Litsey, in Wahpeton, North Dakota. He and his wife, Lauralee, served as missionaries in Africa for eight years. He was preceded in death by his father and one sister, Ella Marie Robeson. Survivors include his wife Lauralee of the home; two sons, Bruce Robeson of Gentry, Arkansas and David Robeson and wife Elizabeth of Siloam Springs, Arkansas; one daughter, Janet Edelbach and husband Gene of Redlands, California; his mother, Lucile Martin Robeson of Cando, North Dakota; five grandchildren; four sisters-in-law; and a number of nieces and nephews. Funeral services will be 3:00 p.m., Saturday, April 8, 2006, at the Gentry Seventh Day Adventist Church, Gentry, Arkansas, with Rev. Ray House officiating.
