March 5, 1921 - January 5, 2006

Wilford "Derrald" Curran, 84 year-old resident of Gentry, Arkansas, died January 5, 2006, at Quail Ridge Living Center, West Siloam Springs, Oklahoma. Born March 5, 1921 in Burlington, Oklahoma, he was the son of Ora Curran and Pauline Whitehead Curran. He lived all his life in Gentry where he was a carpenter.
