September 2, 1916 - May 11, 2010

Wilma Zona Romine, 93, of Gentry, Arkansas, died May 11, 2010, at Siloam Springs Memorial Hospital, Siloam Springs, Arkansas. Born September 2, 1916, in Colony Oklahoma, she was the daughter of William E. Bergthold and Marie Penner Bergthold. She accepted Christ as her personal savior when she was eleven years old. From the time she was a young girl, and throughout her adult life, she was involved with church music and organized gospel singing. Having earned B.A. Degree from Tabor College at Hillsboro, Kansas, a B.S. Degree at John Brown University in Siloam Springs, and M.S. Degree at the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville, Arkansas, gave her a foundation for an extended teaching career in the elementary and the higher education field. She served in the army air force from 1942 to 1945 at Paine Field, Everett, Washington, which included enlistment duty in San Francisco, California. She married Louis L. Romine on March 27, 1975, in Kansas City, Kansas. She was preceded in death by a daughter, Connie Joe Patterson; one great grandchild; her mother and father; brothers, Waldo, Leo, and Bill; and a sister Lodema. Survivors include her husband Louis L. Romine of the home; two step-sons, Michael Romine of Kansas City, Kansas, and Steven Romine of Camdenton, Missouri; nine grandchildren; three brothers, Ernest Bergthold and wife Phobe Ann of Lodi, California, LeRoy Bergthold and wife Catherine of Shawnee Mission, Kansas, and Raymond Bergthold and wife Lucille of Dallas, Texas; one sister, Inez Couch of Gentry, Arkansas; and many great grandchildren and friends.
